An Introduction to Nonfiction Paragraphs

Nonfiction Paragraph Structure. Before we get into the rules, let's briefly go over the main structure of a nonfiction paragraph: 1) Introduce the Topic Sentence. Your first sentence must introduce the topic or thought that you'll be expanding on throughout your paragraph. Your goal is to use a single controlling idea per paragraph.

Rules of Writing a Paragraph for Nonfiction Authors

For non-fiction, theory seems better developed. In non-fiction, you often begin a paragraph with a topic sentence, i.e. a sentence that explains what you are writing about. The sentences that follow are detail sentences supporting the topic sentence. For example: The weather should be good for the picnic tomorrow.
