A tumor suppressor gene is like the brake pedal on a car. It normally keeps the cell from dividing too quickly, just as a brake keeps a car from going too fast. When something goes wrong with the gene, such as a mutation, cell division can get out of control. An important difference between oncogenes and tumor suppressor genes is that oncogenes result from the activation (turning on) of proto-oncogenes, but tumor suppressor genes cause cancer when they are inactivated (turned off).

Tumor Suppressors in BRCA1 Complexes. The best studied BRCA1 gene product, p220, operates, at least in part, as a member of multiple, distinct protein complexes. Many BRCA1-interacting proteins have been reported (1–1); it is unlikely a coincidence that a number of the proteins in these complexes are themselves tumor suppressors, including BRIP1, ABRAVAS, PALB2, RAD50, NBS1, and BRCA2 (2, 4 ...

It seems likely that the formation of these complexes inactivates the cellular protein resulting in an overall effect similar to somatic mutation of the Rb-1 or p53 genes. The HPV16 transforming proteins E7 and E6 complex with protein products of Rb-1 and p53, respectively.

A tumor suppressor gene, or anti-oncogene, is a gene that regulates a cell during cell division and replication. If the cell grows uncontrollably, it will result in cancer. When a tumor suppressor gene is mutated, it results in a loss or reduction in its function; in combination with other genetic mutations, this could allow the cell to grow abnormally. The loss of function for these genes may be even more significant in the development of human cancers, compared to the activation of oncogenes.
